WHAT IS BIP?

Blended Intensive Program Mobility is a type of mobility that is part face-to-face and part online. The participant is obliged to attend both face-to-face and online sessions, and must submit the requested assignment or projects.

WHERE AND WHEN DOES THE BIP STAFF MOBILITY FOR TEACHING TAKE PLACE?

You are expected to participate in the program **ON-SITE** from the 26th to the 30th of May 2025. The program will be held in English.

WHO CAN APPLY?

- Academic staff who are full/part time employed and actively working in the institution for more than 6 months from the following departments:
 - School of Education
 - School of Management
 - School of Communication
- Research assistants who do not have official authority to teach cannot participate in Teaching Mobility.

WHO CANNOT APPLY?

Staff employed through service procurement or staff members who are not in the list given above, cannot apply the current call of application for Erasmus+ Staff Mobility for Teaching.

WHERE DO I APPLY?

Applications must be made through TURNA PORTAL https://turnaportal.ua.gov.tr until the deadline announced by the Erasmus and International Programs Department.

WHAT DOCUMENTS/FORMS ARE NEEDED FOR SUBMISSION?

At the time of application, the following documents must be uploaded.

-Letter of intent indicating 1 method + 1 subject/field of the teaching activity (Mandatory)

-Turkish ID/residency permit (Mandatory)

-TOEFL/YDS/YÖKDİL/e-YDS/e-YÖKDİL Exam Result (if available)*

-Document verifying disability and disadvantage of the applicant with the specified criteria (if available)**

HOW IS THE EVALUATION MADE?

Applications will be evaluated by the IHU Erasmus and International Programs Admission Commission and will be based on the criteria determined by the Turkish National Agency and announced below.

The expected quota for Staff Mobility for Teaching is 3.

- In case there is no application, the program will be canceled and the grant will be transferred to other types of mobility calls (student or staff) as to be decided and announced later by the Erasmus admission committee.
- In faculties/administrative departments with more than one application, only one staff from the same department can receive a grant for the Staff Mobility of Teaching (for example, only one staff in the History Department can have a grant for Staff Mobility for Teaching). The department classification of Human Resources will be taken as a reference.

(i) The departments will be classified according to the list provided by the Human Resources.

(ii) This additional score will be applied only for Staff Mobility for Teaching applications.

(iii) Only a single foreign language test result will be included in the scoring. The exam result with the highest scores for more than one language is taken into consideration.

(iv) The Disability Health Board report specified in the "Regulation on Disability Assessment for Adults" published in the Official Gazette dated February 20, 2019, No. 30692 must be uploaded to TURNAPORTAL.

(v) This additional point is applied when the use/application of artificial intelligence tools is involved in mobility activities. The use of these tools must be specified in the mobility documents (i.e. acceptance letter and/or Mobility Agreement).

(vi) This additional point will be applied to the preferred application of staff who have more than one application. This additional point is applied only once. If selected, it will not apply to the staff's subsequent applications. However, if the staff is not selected, the additional points will continue to be applied to their future applications.

WHAT EXPENSES WILL BE COVERED?







Each participant will receive the following grant amount from 2024-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000201064 Erasmus+ project: $1074 \in (153 \in \text{ for daily grant} + 309 \in \text{ for travel})$. Participants are expected to cover their own expenses from the given budget. No extra grant will be allocated as part of the project rules.

ARE THERE OPPORTUNITIES AND ADDITIONAL GRANT SUPPORT FOR DISABLED AND DISADVANTAGED PARTICIPANTS?

- Beneficiaries with disabilities participating in the Erasmus+ Program can be given additional grants to assist their special needs in addition to the standard grants they receive. Acceptance letter received from the host institution abroad should state that the institution is aware of the needs of the staff and that they can accept the participant.
- In order to be able to receive additional grants to disabled staff, Erasmus+ and International Programs Department should request an additional grant for the staff from the Turkish National Agency. Additional grant requests can be made within the contract period, but in any case, up to 60 days before the end of the contract. Staff with disability will need to contact the Erasmus and International Programs Department for filling the "SPECIAL NEEDS SUPPORT ADDITIONAL GRANT REQUEST FORM". The National Agency evaluates each application individually; it decides whether an additional grant can be given and, if so, the appropriate amount of grant. The forms will be forwarded to the National Agency by the Erasmus and International Programs Department of our university.

Based on the selection, each participant will get one timeslot assigned to deliver a 45-minute guest lecture during the program in Maribor to Academia students (one 45-minute lecture between Monday and Thursday in the afternoon).

The idea is that the participant researches and learns about the method, then uses it in action and delivers a lecture on the topic of their choice. We suggest choosing from the topics (of the field selected) that the staff member is especially passionate about or has extensive expertise in, or presenting good practices from your country/region.

The staff member will be supported in learning about the method via the virtual component <u>before</u> the program in Maribor, lectures/workshops <u>during</u> the program in Maribor, and will gain valuable peer feedback on their lecture delivery <u>during</u> the program in Maribor.
